21st Diwali Celebrations: Reception on 21st October 2022 • 15.30 -17:00 – House of Lords

The Hindu Forum of Britain [HFB] with Parliamentary hosts, Spiritual Commissioners Hindu Samaj and supported by Business community celebrated its 21<sup>st</sup> Diwali celebrations at the House of Lords on 21<sup>st</sup> October 2022.

Sri Veljibhai Vekaria, Chair of the Diwali committee, welcomed guests on this great occasion and introduced Ms. Reena Ranger as the anchor for the 21<sup>st</sup> Diwali celebrations. In honour of HM The Queen Elizabeth II, and all other departed souls, Smt. Harshaben Shukla MBE, Vice President North, requested everyone to observe a short silence before the festivities began.

Harshaben invited the President of HFB and Trustee of the HFB Charity, Smt. Truptiben Patel, on the stage to address the guests and deliver importance and significance of Diwali . Smt. Truptiben invited Spiritual commissioner Swami Suryaprabha Didi from Brahmrishi Ashram UK, and Shree Radha Mohan Dasa from ISKCON Bhaktivedanta Manor to light the lamps and give blessings by reciting a mantra to mark the beginning of the festival. Truptiben delivered a short Diwali message incorporating : "Diwali is associated with Prabhu Shri Ram. If we want to live in Ram Rajya, we need to be mindful, respectful but stand our ground, it is important that we don't get bullied by people! We do not believe in raising a sword, but we believe in the power of persuasion! Let us all work together for achieving Ram Rajya in this country and in Bharat.'

Truptiben invited Reena, Councillor at Hertfordshire County Council and Joint Chair of the Conservative Friends of India, to continue with the celebrations. Reena invited Lord Rami Ranger, Padmashree Bob Blackman MP, the Chair of the APPG for British Hindus, and Sri Shashibhai Vekaria, Patron of the HFB on stage and commended them for their continuous efforts and support to the Hindu community by awarding them with a certificate and a shawl. Lord Rami Ranger addressed the guests, 'We are in House of Lords, first community Diwali here, keep up the message of Lord Rama to uphold family values, self-respect, respect for communities and our country'.

Bob Blackman MP gave his empowering, clear and direct speech, addressing those present: "As we approach this wonderful event, and we join with Hindus, Sikhs and Jains to celebrate Diwali, I was re-elected as the chairman of the all party Parliamentary group for British Hindus, earlier this week. So, as I've always said to all of you, I and my colleagues will act as your voice in this sovereign parliament to make sure that you are heard by Government, Parliament and the people beyond, and I will make sure there is no back-tracking on this particular commitment to ensure that British Hindu voices can be heard. We will not accept, in this country, people not being able to go about their lawful business and celebrate their religion, and my message has been to all the communities I've been to, in Navaratri, and I

will say in Diwali as well, be proud of being a Hindu, let everyone know you are a Hindu! You have the absolute right to celebrate in this country without fear of reprisals or any action against you because of your religion!"

Lord Navnit Dholakia and Sri Rickie Segal , both Patrons of the HFB , were called on stage, and presented shawls and certificate of appreciation to Sri Rickie Sehgal. Lord Navnit Dholakia gave an address, 'happy Diwali' and congratulated the Hindu Community, majority who arrived as refugees from Uganda 50 years ago and contributing immensely to the economic and wellbeing of the British Society.

Deputy High Commissioner of India, H.E. Sri Sujit Ghosh present on the stage, received his shawl, which Veljibhai had the honour of presenting. Shortly after, followed an address by H.E.Sri Sujit Ghosh, on the importance of what Diwali stands for: "This is the UK's way of saying thank you to the community for the contribution that you have made for the progress of this country. So, I again congratulate you on this and I wish you all prosperity, all health and wisdom, something that Diwali stands for in the year to come! Diwali stands for diversity, inclusivity, and stands for being together as a family and that has been the core message that the Indian civilisation has been giving out over the last thousands of years, one of 'Vasudaiva Kutumbhakam' - the world is one family."

Hon. Theresa Villars MP was invited on the stage and & Sri Bimal Patel, President of BBS. had the honour of presenting a shawl to her. Hon. Theresa Villars MP continued to give a speech to all those present. "It is great honor to be back with HFB to the annual Diwali celebrations, my great pleasure to wish you all a Happy Diwali. [5] I think this is a very fit setting to celebrate the contribution of the British Indians and Hindu community in Britain. Hindus, Sikhs and Jains have been successful in building businesses, in becoming professionals, in contributing to our economy, our society, our culture and our services.
